Clearing the air: atmospheric pollution and fake news

Learning objectives

- 1 Identify atmospheric pollutants and how they are produced.
- 2 Describe the impact that these pollutants have on society and the environment.
- 3 Create a news article to summarise your findings.
- 4 Evaluate sources for reliability.

Introduction

Atmospheric pollution is when chemical compounds in the atmosphere, usually made by human activity, have a negative impact on us and our environment. Often, they are produced when fossil fuels are burned and contribute to climate change, acid rain and smog.

Instructions

- Use the infographic poster and fact sheet to learn more about atmospheric pollutants, how they are formed and their impact on society and the environment.
- Use the internet to research atmospheric pollutants. Ensure that the sources of information you find are reliable and are not sources of misinformation. Record the full URL for the source of any information you find so that your reader can check for reliability.
- Create a news article summarising your findings on atmospheric pollutants. You can use one of the templates provided or make up your own format to suit your article and audience. Include the following:
 - What are the names and formulas of the pollutants?
 - How are they formed?
 - What impact do they have on society?
 - What impact do they have on the environment?
 - Can you describe these impacts using your chemical knowledge?
 - What can be done to minimise these impacts?
